## UNIT 1 Class E! (coursebook)

Main theme : Internet friends around the world
Lesson 1 : Do you like computers? (45 minutes)
Language level: Intermediate.
Language skills: Reading- listening -writing.
Vocabulary to be learned: Words related to computer parts and internet use.
Main grammar: Like /don't like --- likes /doesn't like +ing/noun.
A)WARMING UP (5 minutes)

1) Skills: Speaking.
2) Aim: to get pupils acquainted with the culture of internet.
-I enter the class and greet the kids .I name the 'little helper'.
-I ask ps to open the coursebook to take a look at p13 (coverpage) and answer the following questions:
a) Where do you come from?
b) What do you know about internet or not?
c)Do you have computer -do you use internet?
B) MAIN TEACHING PROCEDURE: ( 15 minutes)
3) Skills:

Reading-writing an e-mail. Speaking about computers.
2) Aim:
-To teach vocabulary related to computers and educational internet.
-To familiarize ps with the format of e-mail
-To teach how to ask and express preferences interests.
3) Objectives:
-To activate ps background knowledge.
-To encourage ps guesswork and predicting skills.
-To practice language related to vocabulary -pronunciation.
-To enhance collaborative skills.
-To motivate ps to read an e-mail.
-To make learners active readers.
4)Stages.
I) Lead in
-We altogether visit the computer lab.
-We start talking about computer's benefits- drawbacks, using 'brainstorming'. I write them on board forming two lists: for negative -positive aspects.
-I check what vocabulary they know what each computer's item does.
II) Presentation
-Using the words flash cards (1) I let students guess the meaning and give them explanation if necessary.

-I give them further information about internet and its uses handing out a photocopy with related topics or presenting them at the projector (2).
-Reading: After giving some oral information about educational internet (I mention to Australian children doing their schooling through internet -e-mail), I ask ps to read in pairs( silently) and pay attention to the format of e-mail; address- subjectparagraphing(coursebook p15 act. c).
-While reading: They complete the information which follows (p15 act.c)
-Post reading:Ps present their findings.
-Writing:I write the following structure on board: like/don't like
-likes/ doesn't like +-ing/noun -I ask pupils to copy in their notebooks- I explain that this is a way to express preferences.
III) Practice- Production 22 minutes.
A)-I give out the copies( 3) and make sure pupils can identify the activities pictured in the chart.
-I tell them that they are going to hear what four children like doing after school. They have to fill in the chart by putting a tick or a cross in the appropriate column.
-I read the following text or pre-record it onto a cassette and play the tape.

After school, Sue likes watching TV and reading books. She doesn't like playing computer games but her brother Jack does. He also likes listening to music and riding his bike. His friend Tom likes riding his bike too, but he doesn't like reading books. Sue's friend Luisa likes playing tennis after school. She also likes
watching TV at Sue's house, but she doesn't like listening to Jack's music

B)

Pupils work together in groups to complete the worksheet.

1 They choose four after-school hobbies/activities and write or draw these down the left-hand side of the table.

2 They then each choose 4 or 5 different classmates to question.

3 Pupils go round the class asking their chosen classmates: Do you like ...? If they answer Yes, I do they put a $J$ next to the activity.

4 Back in their groups they each add up their own totals and add these together to make a class total.

5 Pupils can collate their information by preparing a poster with drawings/magazine pictures of their chosen activities and the number of children who like them. Display these on the classroom walls.
